

No budget?

Due to the critical importance of generators in an emergency situation, grant money for generators is often available to bypass budget concerns. The Department of Homeland Security offers a number of grant programs, including the State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) and the Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (LETPP). In addition, grants are available through FEMA as well as through "preference items" from state and local legislators. For details, check with your county funding source or State Agency Headquarters.

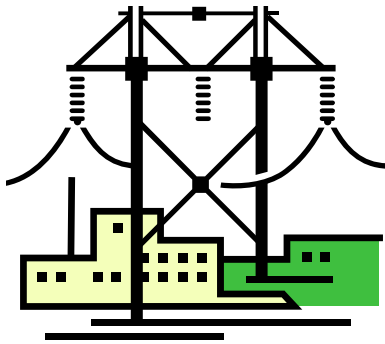

Imagine....

Need advice???

Use contract items to make sure you purchase the right generator, operate it correctly, and get prompt help in case of problems. To get started:



- Request an expert visit to your site early in the process to specify, survey, and discuss (#SVR001S)
- Request a second visit after installation for start up and training (#STS001S)
- Install remote control software for the fastest remote monitoring, controlling, and troubleshooting from any PC computer—GenLink software, cable, and modem (#GEN471S—GEN473S)
